Dear Student

As a life-long member of Levenshulme High School's learning community, I wanted to take this opportunity to share some of the many wonderful achievements and successes enjoyed by your peers at school since you finished your examinations and reflect more generally on the year itself.

I would like to begin with remembering our Ofsted rating of 'Outstanding' – you played a role in helping secure this super recognition for all the work that goes on at LHS - thank you. You might have seen us on television too; we were chosen, in June, to take part in the 'Be Kind' campaign that ITV's 'This Morning' programme is running. This involved the making of a short film about our anti-bullying work and the school culture and ethos, which they broadcast during one of their programmes last month. As always, you represented yourselves and your school brilliantly and we are very proud of all of you.

There have been so many wonderful achievements and experiences, in so many different areas of school life, throughout the year that it is not possible to write about them here and do them justice. Should you wish to collect your results on any other day after 24th August 2017, you must phone the school in advance and make an appointment.
